Looking Back: A Year In Review...

St. Vincent Mission 2015 April 19-24

Rita Colley Hendrickson After repeated requests for our services, WBO was able to arrange for a trip to St Vincent, located in the Eastern Caribbean. Because a direct flight was not an option, travel arrangements posed a slight challenge and a leap of faith. The medical supplies, which are normally checked on the airline had to be shipped separately and in advance. Fortunately, the WBO Team and all of our supplies reached our destination safely and on time.

We worked with the Fidel Ceasar Foundation, whose mission is to bring all types of medical care to the area. They had two Cuban doctors on staff who were recently hired by their government to try to meet the needs of the local population. We had a wonderful professional exchange with them. They formed a special bond with everyone on our team, especially Mark Jessen, M.D., who is the senior resident in ophthalmology at the Penn State Hershey

Medical Center We learned a great deal from them and were able to demonstrate some advanced surgical techniques to help expand their skills.

St. Vincent is a beautiful area, but lacking in medical care. The population is underserved in many ways, just like many of our other mission destinations. We repaired about 75 cataracts and Dr. Melvis Diaz Pena performed several pterygium surgeries. This technique is used to remove a growth on the cornea, which if not moved, can impair vision. Overall, another very rewarding mission.

The team worked extremely hard and was very productive. It's fascinating to watch as first-time volunteers work with our Domincan colleagues, some of whom we have known for over 20 years. The work we perform changes lives and the friendships we establish through our work will last a lifetime!

Dr. Joanna Olson, who joined us for her first WBO mission, is a senior resident at Penn State/Hershey Medical Center and she performed like a seasoned veteran. Although she has been trained to take advantage of every opportunity that the best equipment and technology provide, she exhibited great skills in adapting to different techniques and a vastly different surgical environment. Similarly, Emily Simone proved her value to the team with excellent nursing skills and compassion for our patients on her first mission.

We were able to perform over 80 cataract procedures and Dr. Chaudhry worked his magic via 7 corneal transplant surgeries – many of them children! The mis-

sion also created a nice family experience, in that Dr. Alley's wife, Ginny, his niece, Madison and grand-daughter, Lani joined the team and were able to meet some of our Dominican friends – who have become much like family to all of us.
